Rossana Mendes Fonseca is an artist, curator, and researcher in Art, Aesthetics, and Philosophy. Her work, both visual and written, artistic and academic, constitutes an attempt to think the image as the sensitive matter of modern and contemporary audiovisual apparatus, and as access to a present in which all times coexist, only revealed by the infra-ordinary of objects, the déjà vu of memory, and the perception of any moment.

Settling within a creative, heterogeneous, and diverse community, her curatorial practice seeks to incite artists to find a different approach to their work, whether it be more emerging or already established.

She lives in Porto, with occasional interludes in Paris, where she studied Photography (Spéos International School of Photography, 2010) and where she conducted her research for her Ph.D in Contemporary Art (at the College of Arts of the University of Coimbra, 2024), with a thesis on "Perception, Time, and Memory in the Genesis of Photography," and the presentation of the photobook *(e)vidências*.

A proper flâneuse, in Paris, she found her favorite bookstores and spaces for reading and art. She frequented the Kandinsky Library, the Centre Georges Pompidou, the Maison Européenne de la Photographie, the Palais de Tokyo, the Salon de Lecture du Musée du Quai Branly, or the Galerie Binome. Henri Bergson, Gilles Deleuze, Paul Virilio, or Michel Foucault became her great travel companions, as did Hiroshi Sugimoto, Jeff Wall, Ana Mendieta, Rui Chafes, or Eva Hesse.

In Porto, she studied at the Faculty of Fine Arts of the University of Porto (2011), obtaining a Master's Degree in Artistic Studies - Theory and Criticism of Art. She became a resident artist at the CRU creative hub in 2013. She took over the curation of the space's exhibition program in 2017, seeking to activate relationships within and outside its vast creative community and to find in its installations a continuous experimentation through the diversity of the works that inhabit it. She

collaborated with the e-commerce company Farfetch, between 2015 and 2023, in various fields, such as Copywriting, Image Quality Control, or Product Photography and Styling.

Teaching was always a relevant course of action. She taught, between 2016 and 2022, artistic, practical, and theoretical disciplines such as Photography, Image and Sound, or Ethics and Deontology of Image, in higher education (ESEV), artistic (Soares dos Reis Art School), and professional schools (Balleteatro Professional School).

With an incursion, between 2011 and 2017, in the Aesthetics, Politics, and Knowledge research group of the Institute of Philosophy of the University of Porto, she recently became an integrated member of the same group.

As an artist, she exhibited mainly photographic series and video art, between Porto, Paris, and Cagliari. She created *Duck Soup*, a magazine with two editions to date whose themes were the Creative Environment and the House, that aims to give visibility to artists with very specific approaches to those topics. She wrote essays on art, cinema, and contemporary dance for the Venice Film Festival (2010), Guimarães European Capital of Culture (2011), for the Porto Municipal Theater (DDD! 2017-2018 and Anarquivo 2018-2019), and for Balleteatro (Mnemónica 2023), among others. She also wrote for magazines such as Vogue (2019-2020), Elle (2019), or Shifter (2023).

From intuition as a Bergsonian methodological practice and from a certain anachronism as an assumption of the discontinuity of the Real, she finds in the idea of Time her great question of life and in Art her course of action.
