Hamlet the prince. He is a young man A man who was somehow related to a king Hamlet is the prince of Denmark and it all starts with that his father is dead Hamlet's dad was the king Hamlet's uncle is the king and has married his mother

This is the Middle Ages, or something There's a king And there's a betrayal It begins like this: "there is something rotten in the heart of Denmark"

Hamlet is a King Hamlet is not the king Hamlet might be a king Hamlet is maybe the prince Hamlet is the prince of Denmark

There's an advisor There's an advisor to the king There's an advisor to the king that is supposed to have the power but someone tries to take it from him There's an advisor

He wears a donkey head

His name is Polonius He has killed Hamlet's father Hamlet's mother, Tatanya, is completely evil, and in love with Polonius donkey head

Someone is betraying someone to take power from the king There are a lot of complications Someone tells something to someone and is misunderstood, it goes over to someone else and someone dies in vain Someone is doing it for his or her own interest, just telling something to someone that shouldn't know about something, just twisting the truth a little along the chain There should be also a love story The main thing is not the love story That's a parallel thing Someone tried to betray Hamlet to get the power It's about kingdoms Someone is cheating Hamlet Someone's dying Hamlet's dying Hamlet is not the one that dies Someone dies Hamlet's loved one died That was not meant to happen

## There's the whole conflict

Hamlet is not the bad guy in this Hamlet is involved Hamlet is the victim Hamlet is a bit naive and stupid Hamlet has a really short bangs He's blond

He wears leggings and some kind of princess-like knight shorts

Hamlet's costume is kind of king-ish, and darkish, brown, grey, black, a bit lion-ish in colors, with some small red parts in it

But didn't Hamlet kill his mom? Hamlet kills his mom Or his dad Or both. And then himself

This has some kind of Oedipus story in it So, then, Hamlet would kill his mother Hamlet falls in love with his mother That's why Hamlet kills his father Hamlet kills the king and then he, or someone he commissions, also kills the mother

In fact, it all starts with three witches that
 tell the story:
Hamlet was a person named after a small village
The village was on an island
An enchanted island
Hamlet's father died and haunted him and the
whole village

Hamlet overheard the father was killed by a man pouring poison into his ear Hamlet's father was killed by the lover of Hamlet's mother Hamlet's father has been murdered by Hamlet's uncle Hamlet's father has just been murdered by Hamlet's uncle Now he is the king Hamlet's father's ghost keeps appearing Hamlet's father's ghost is caught in that loop Hamlet is visited by his father's ghost

There's a play within the play There's always a play within the play There's a play within a play in that play In the play within the play they kill somebody In the play within the play, the fake play, there's a banquet

They poor poison in someone's ear in the play within the play They pour poison in the king's ear The Queen pours poison in the king's ear That King is King Lear. That's why it's in his ear It's King Lear Lear it's French It's old Old English was very connected to French

The play within the play is one of Hamlet's ways of seeing whether his uncle is actually the murderer or not Supposedly it's a parody Complete fiction Completely fictitious But it strikes a chord It starts a rumor amongst those watching They're all sitting there Watching Very politely And then they realize that it actually happened

Hamlet gets very upset As usual He's pretty much an upset character

It's difficult for Hamlet

Hamlet's options are to kill or to kill himself Hamlet is going to do the killing Or not Hamlet is going to kill himself instead

There is a skull

Hamlet is holding the skull "at last poor Yorick, I knew him well' Hamlet holds his skull in the hand Hamlet looks the skull in the eyes Or, well, the eye sockets And he does his famous speech Hamlet does the To be or not to be speech

"To be or not to be that is the question" "To be or not to be that is the question" ... and then it gets really blurry

And then there's some things about dreams and not dreams and reality and not reality To be or not to be is the longest speech About whether to be or not to be Hamlet was thinking about not being

There is a lot of death in this And then there is Ophelia

Hamlet is also in love with A woman called Ophelia is in love with But this is not This is this But this is It feels like it's No one remembers her so well

At some point Ophelia drowns She does kill herself Because Hamlet is so caught up in his grief And confusion And issues And roles And masculinity Hamlet is tied up in his own madness Hamlet is no longer sure where reality is Hamlet's own death is the only potential future for Hamlet Hamlet casts her aside

## She drowns

Ophelia's drowning is an aside Ophelia's ghost comes back Ophelia's ghost is in places where she doesn't say anything There's no room for Ophelia

Ophelia is central Ophelia is not central Ophelia is often cited Ophelia is very central We don't get Ophelia's side Ophelia has like Three lines In a white dress Ghost-like etherealness of a death displaced from the stage Very minimal

Who's Ophelia actually? Ophelia is the sister Ophelia was unhappy Ophelia didn't get Hamlet as partner Ophelia makes herself a hat like a bonnet of flowers Then she goes off

Ophelia is the sister Yeah, Ophelia is central Ophelia poisoned herself Drowned in a blood pool Drowned somewhere It was not somebody holding her under But more like taking poison

Going into the water and laying Drowning Ophelia is a bold person Ophelia doesn't speak so much but Ophelia is a strong character Ophelia takes action, bold decisions Ophelia is quite big She commits suicide That's the grand finale This is not just politics or family drama This is a tragedy This is a tragic story, yeah This is about power and conquering This is about who's going to conquer and take the power This is mostly about power Then love and death It's a heavily masculine piece

85, maybe 90% man, 10% female

People die, tragedies happen, more people die But it's all about Hamlet's own angst Hamlet knows what he wants But Hamlet makes bad decisions Hamlet doesn't cope very well It's obvious what he should do But Hamlet can't do it

Hamlet is often very melancholic or depressed This rotten thing is partly in Hamlet as well Hamlet is not well-equipped enough Hamlet doesn't know anything Hamlet is just realising what's happened

That's why the witches like it

Hamlet is not so important It's that Things get disguised Words get used Thoughts get shown It's a tragic story

Hamlet is a teenager Hamlet just understands that the world is a horrible place Hamlet doesn't really want to be there Hamlet is grieving Hamlet is very conflicting It's difficult for Hamlet

Hamlet is dealing with righteousness and masculinity Hamlet feels like he should be avenging the death of his father through violent means

Hamlet should kill his uncle But Hamlet doesn't want to Hamlet is very conflicted Hamlet has to do the right thing Hamlet has to do the thing that is expected of him

As a man and as a prince Hamlet starts to wonder whether he's going mad It's a tragedy

Hamlet feels sorry
Hamlet feels really
Hamlet understands how he's implicated in the
 death of innocent people
Like Ophelia
It's definitely a tragedy

Everybody kills everybody else on a daily basis
It's a tradition of folks getting killed and
folks killing each other
Everybody's killing each other all the time, just
willingly
No big deal
"How many people did you kill today?"
"Seven"
"How many did you kill?"
"just one"

In the ending everybody dies There's a big sword fight, bloodbath Pretty much everyone died It's not poison It ends with everybody dying or being killed It's really like swords and stubbing and Everybody dies The mother dies as well Someone has to have died by poison Maybe the mother Everybody's poisoned Swords, poison, poison Somebody got stabbed or cut, or throat cut Dagger, sword, dagger, poison This story gets lost in total tragedy mess A major death scene, which is the end, when everyone has been poisoned There's lots of death in it

There's lots of death in it But someone must be alive in the end Everyone dies Yorick is very important Rosencrantz and Guildenstern are reported dead Ariel survived and Cordelia survived The witches go on and on, just telling the same story, over and over. That's their function.
