#### Curriculum Vitae

Ilya Orlov (1973) is an artist and historian, a PhD candidate at the The Academy of Fine Arts, Helsinki. He graduated from the Faculty of Liberal Arts and Sciences (a partnership of St. Petersburg State University and Bard College, NY), where he majored in history, philosophy, political sciences and art. His undergraduate work focused on revolutionary mourning rituals in 1917, and he authored an MA-dissertation on aesthetics of nature and issues of landscape in contemporary curatorial studies. Orlov addresses artistic research from the standpoint of critical theory, the avant-garde, and neo-conceptual approaches. He has exhibited at the State Museum of Political History, St. Petersburg; the National Center for Contemporary Art, Moscow; the Moscow Museum of Modern Art, The State Tretiakov Gallery, Moscow. He also participated in the 4th Moscow Biennale; in the Manifesta 10, St. Petersburg. In 2014 he shortlisted for Innovation Prize, the Russian state award for contemporary art. Ilya Orlov is a member of Rab-Rab committee, a board of *Rab-Rab: Journal for Political and Formal Inquiries in Art*.
