Project blog https://meetingswithtrees. com How to rethink our relationship to other life forms that we share this planet with is one of the core questions for art and philosophy today. In the artistic research project "Meetings with Remarkable and Unremarkable Trees", I encounter individual trees that are remarkable in their context or rather unremarkable and spend time with them alone or together with the public in order to create video works and video essays.

The project is further developing experiences from the artistic research project "Performing with Plants" as well as some previous publications discussing performing with trees (Arlander 2010; 2015; 2019; 2020c) and what that might mean.



The title of this artistic research project alludes to the celebrated photography book *Meetings with Remarkable Trees* (1996) by Thomas Pakenham and is in some sense forming a counterpoint to it, by questioning what is remarkable and what is unremarkable, while focusing on individual trees. The medium in this project is not photography, however, but rather performance for video and recorded voice.

Although we are often accused of "not seeing the forest for the trees", this project wants to look at the opposite danger, not seeing the trees for the forest, and look at individual trees. This is not to deny that trees form networks and ecosystems or symbiotic relationships not only with other trees but with fungi, bacteria and all kinds of micro-organisms, and are in a constant exchange with their environment, as humans are as well.

Emphasizing individualism is a risky strategy in our current neoliberal capitalist society, where the importance of individualism is exaggerated anyway. It can nevertheless be useful to focus on singular trees, as an important first step towards decolonizing our relationship with 'nature'.

As late ecofeminist Val Plumwood (2003) pointed out, colonial thinking tends to emphasize a very strong difference between 'us' and 'them', and to see 'them' as all alike, stereotypical, non-individualised. Thus, attending to particular trees might work as a way to help us see trees as life forms that we have much in common with, despite our undeniable differences.



Artistically the project can be placed at the intersection of performance art, environmental art and video or media art, in the encounter of traditions – performance art's emphasis on embodied presence, video- and media art's valuing of repetition, transformation and critical reflection on technology as well as environmental art's sensitivity to the possible effects and side effects an artwork can have.

Historically speaking, there is no lack of artistic engagement with plants, from vegetally inspired music or ornamentation on textiles, pottery and architecture, to paintings, poems and science fiction stories of plants. Living plants are used as material in practices as divergent as garden design, sonification, floral arrangements and contemporary bio art. Plants and vegetation are receiving increased attention in the context of the current climate crises and the rapid extinction of species. With the developments in plant science and the post-humanities artists, artist-researchers and scholars are looking at plants in new ways. The growing interest in plant studies, to some extent as a further development of the burgeoning of animal studies and post-humanist thinking, is influencing art and artistic research as well.



In scholarly terms the project could be situated within the emerging field of critical plant studies, which has been be linked to art's return to vegetal life and to looking at plants in art (Gibson & Brits 2018; Gibson 2018; Aloi 2018). Other discussions have focused on plant rights (Hall 2011), plant philosophy or plant thinking (Marder 2013; Irigaray and Marder 2016; Coccia 2019), plant theory (Nealon 2016; Myers 2017), the language of plants (Vieira, Gagliano, and Ryan 2015; Kranz, Schwan, Wittrock 2016; Gagliano, Ryan and Vieira 2017) queer plants (Sandilands 2017) and more.

There is a current 'plant turn' in science, philosophy and environmental humanities, accompanied by an abundance of popular accounts of recent scientific research on plant sentience, intelligence, memory and communication (Pollan 2002; Mancuso & Viola 2015, Wohlleben 2016; Chamovitz 2017; Gagliano 2018). For example, four issues of *Antennae* are devoted to plants, as are recent issues of *Performance Philosophy* and *Ruukku - studies in artistic research*.



Rethinking our relationship to other forms of life that we share this planet with is a central task for artists today. Artistic research can contribute through its capacity to allow and to generate hybrid forms of thinking and acting. This project wants to contribute to this growing field with examples of relatively simple artistic practices.

The project has resulted in video essays and video installations to be shown in the context of contemporary art. The activities of the project were documented on a blog and in an exposition on the Research Catalogue, an international database for artistic research. The outcomes are also shared at international conferences, in local seminars and in journal articles in the context of critical plant studies, performance studies and artistic research.

In this context my working method, my way of documenting all meetings with trees and sharing the material online, as an ongoing process, is perhaps the most interesting aspect.

One way of structuring the project is through specific sites, periods in particular residencies, as in the project blog <u>https://meetingswithtrees.com</u>


A third way is through articulating the various strategies or techniques utilized or developed, which I use here.

Considerations

Format of RC archive (and type of editor)

- Timeline, horizontal grouping, vertical chronology

- all activities or selected highlights only

Online documenting and archiving as a method – but why share it publicly?

- What parts of this material will be useful in the future, as part of exhibitions, or submitted to the Finnish Distribution Centre for Media Art?
- What parts am I going to write about or compile video essays of?

Various structural strategies

- Year-long time-lapse videos with specific trees (usually once a week), a further development of recording the landscape on Harakka Island in the series Animal Years (2002-2014)
- <u>A day with a tree (usually every two-hours or every three-hours) based on Animal Days and Nights on</u> Harakka (2002-2014), often with journal notes after each session
- Posing with a tree <u>daily for a month</u>, usually the two-legged tree pose
- Writing <u>letters to trees</u> next to the trees
- <u>Talking to trees</u>, real time recordings, also as podcast episodes




