

## ① STADS BIBLIOTEKET

- Low C drone, making slight rhythms with bow and keys
- Soft tremolo on C and D<sup>b</sup>
- Key sounds (like footsteps in hall)
- Rapid triplets on C or without any tone

## ② BREDÅNG FÄGLAR

- Imitate an angry Björk trash or Skata (ch-ch-ch-ch)
- Fluttery tremolo on Middle D, sometimes adding the E<sup>b</sup> above
- Bounce the bow rapidly on the E<sup>b</sup> above D so it makes more noise than not

## ③ FÄGEL Melodi

- Play the melody
- Drone on F
- Play the rhythm - 3-2-2-3-2 with B<sup>b</sup> in the bass

## ④ TEKNISKA HÖGSKOLAN T

- Constant running notes on one pitch (like the escalator)
- Drone on A below middle C, sometimes adding A<sup>b</sup> above it
- Make gronky rhythm by bowing sideways
- Imitate turnstiles

## ⑤ GEOPESIC RytM I

- Learn melody from recording - open C and alternate rhythm around melody in mode - D E<sup>b</sup> F A C

### GEOPESSIC RytM II

- ⑥ → Slow, airy open chords in  $\frac{3}{4}$ : G B A D C B D C B A D  
(similar to ⑤)

## ⑦ GEODESIC RYTM III

→ Play triplets: A A F | A A F | G A F | G A F o.s.u.  
(similar to ⑥)

## ⑧ GEODESIC RYTM II

→ Play RUNNING TRIPLETS with RHYTHMIC ORNAMENTS ON G  
(similar to ⑥)

## ⑨ GEODESIC RYTM III

→ VARIED MELODIC DRONE ON C<sup>#</sup> (ABOVE MIDDLE C)  
→ RAPID IMPROVISED ORNAMENTS in MODE: C E F# G# AND AS YOU LIKE  
(similar to ⑦)

## ⑩ GEODESIC RYTM IV

→ SLOW SING-SONG Melody with PAUSES between G<sub>1</sub> AND A<sup>(UNISON)</sup>  
(LEARN FROM RECORDING)

→ MELODY from RECORDING, MODE G A C D (E)

## ⑪ SKÄR HOLMENS BRYGGA

→ Soft, AIRY DRONE ON A below Middle C which almost disappears sometimes  
→ Soft, AIRY DRONE ON E above Middle C with occasional D  
→ Pizz/keys to imitate bells on boats  
→ Soft KNOCKING  
→ SING-SONG DRONE between A below middle C and occasional low A
