Course Title:

Listening for a Lexicon

Transart transdisciplinary workshops and seminars are topically driven. Workshops address development of artistic praxis rather than training in certain media or authoring tools, challenging students to think conceptually and work creatively in new ways. Students respond to assignments and exercises in whatever media they wish. Seminars which are the cultural studies equivalent of the workshops help students to put their work in context and find ways to inform their art projects through research while also getting experience articulating these new ideas, ways of thinking and making connections through readings, discussions, exercises and assignments. Plan on 20 students.

Final course description for website:

Part of my research into the roles of attention(s) in creative process is establishing a lexicon developed through dialogues with creative practitioners themselves, rather than imposed terminology or jargon. This presentation will introduce my research concepts and engage the audience in a discussion of their own experiences as research-based creative practitioners.

The session will be audio recorded and transcribed for a post-session review of language and terminology that will be included in the lexicon. Participants will be asked to sign a waiver allowing the use of language and terms that arise throughout the session in the lexicon without individual attribution. Participants will be given the option to have their name included in a group attribution of the session for use in the dissertation or further publications, or to opt-out of co-attribution.


