Femonationalism, sometimes known as feminationalism, is the association between a nationalist ideology and some feminist ideas, especially when construing xenophobic political platforms.

The term was originally proposed by the researcher Sara R. Farris to refer to the processes by which some powers line up with the claims of the feminist movement in order to justify racist, xenophobic and aporophobic positions, basing them on prejudices that migrant people are supposedly sexist and that Western society is entirely egalitarian.

The main critiques of this phenomenon focus on the partial and sectarian use of the feminist movement to further ends based in intolerance and ignoring the sexism and lack of real equality in Western society as a whole.
