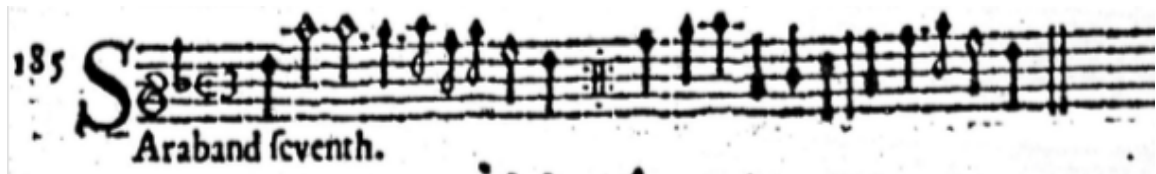


13. Sea Shell Saraband

Activity description	<p>Without violin</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• In a circle, have all hands out so the RH is on the top of a persons LH. A ball is passed from one hand to another keeping a regular beat. This is done whilst the song is sung• The song is taught whilst clapping the 1st and 2nd beats• In a circle clap this together, so clapping to the person on each side• Use a drum to do the same activity whilst continuing to sing <p>With violin</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Connect with the phrasing of the singing
