Christina Stadlbauer: Curriculum Vitae

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Christina is an artist, researcher and creative producer. She has been working at the interstices of arts and sciences, with natural phenomena and the complexity of processes. Her work - exhibitions, workshops and events - has been shown in Europe and around the world - Kaai Theater (Brussels, 2011), Salo Museum of Contemporary Art (Finland, 2011); Pixelache Festival (2010 – 2016, Finland), Jardín Etnobotánico de Oaxaca (Mexico, 2012), Fundaciò Joan Mirò (Barcelona, 2018) and others.

Christina obtained a PhD in chemistry and has worked both in academia and in culture / art organizations as well as independently. Since 2008, she has been focusing and working at the interstices of arts and sciences, in particular with honeybees and their environments.

Between 2010 and 2013, Christina was creative and artistic co-director at the trans-disciplinary laboratory FoAM vzw, in Brussels. She implemented projects, lectures, workshops and residencies, related to urban resilience initiatives and has worked with groups and in teams. As coordinator of the European Project EITC (European Initiative of Transformative Cultures), with a consortium of European and Mexican organisations, Christina realized workshops, seminars and events both in Mexico and in Europe.

Currently, Christina is engaged in the long term art and research project Melliferopolis – Bees in Urban Environments, with Ulla Taipale. This independent initiative was affiliated to Future Art Base / Biofilia (Aalto University), has collaborated with Helsinki City, Kaisaniemi Botanic Garden (University of Helsinki) and Luomos.

In her art work, Christina Stadlbauer engages with topics that are inspired by nature- especially plants and insects. Amongst the pieces that she created are tangible objects, outdoor installations, as well as ephemeral actions or rituals. Christina particularly likes to address the senses; many of her pieces can be experienced by touch or smell. The possibility for the audience to actively engage or participate in the art piece or intervention is crucial. The spectator and his reaction become part of the art piece and make it kaleidoscopic and open ended.

Christina is fascinated by the vegetal world – plant sensing, communication and ecology and explores plant neuro-biology as artistic research. Christina has practiced Kin Tsugi for many years and she is leading a Kin Tsugi practice group in Helsinki.

Christina is a member and co-founder of the collective r-Ohm vzw, in Brussels. The collective has co-designed the programation for the European Capital of Culture 2018, Leeuwarden (NL), around the topic "Farm of the World". Affiliation to the trans-disciplinary artistic laboratory FoAM (Brussels, http://fo.am) and the University of Applied Life Sciences (BOKU), Vienna. Christina is in the board of the BioArt Society, Finland (https://bioartsociety.fi) and is part of the Nordic DIY network. Christina is a Shiatsu practitioner and speaks several languages (German, Italian, English, French, Dutch and basic Finnish).
