Entry Requirements

General Entry Requirements:

for studies at the first cycle with the exception of Swedish 1, 2 and 3.

Specific Entry Requirements:

120 credits in artistic subjects or didactics/pedagogy with an artistic focus.

Selection

The selection is made through a joint assessment of the applicant's previous artistic and/or didactic and pedagogical merits and work samples. The assessment is based on the applicant's ability to solve given tasks, problems or questions.

Language of Instruction

The main language of instruction is English.

Course Content

Artography, or A/R/Tography, is a hybrid research methodology with which it is possible to explore educational practice through artistic practice. The method emphasizes three positions: Artist (A), Researcher (R), and Teacher (T), and how these can be combined. The aim of the course is for the participants to acquire tools to put their own teaching in an artographic perspective, and to be able to supervise students and others in artographic processes.

The Course consists of the following modules:

A/R/Tography in Theory, 2.5 credits

During the module, the student will acquire a theoretical and methodological understanding of A/R/Tography in general as well as acquire a deeper understanding of an independent and defined area within the field of artography specifically.

A/R/Tography in Practice, 5 credits

During the module, the student carries out an artographic research project based on their own teaching. During the module, the student participates in collegial supervision and creates a digital exposition.

Teaching Forms

Workshop, lecture, seminar, peer-review, independent work under supervision.

Intended Learning Outcomes

A/R/Tography in Theory, 2.5 credits

After completing the course the student is able to:

- 1) give an account of A/R/Tography as a hybrid research methodology,
- 2) give an account of A/R/Tography as a field within research and teaching,
- 3) demonstrate an in-depth understanding of a chosen area within the artographic field supported by relevant literature.

A/R/Tography in *Practice*, 5 credits

After completing the course the student is able to:

- 4) demonstrate ability to apply A/R/Tography as a research methodology,
- 5) present an artographic process in a digital presentation,
- 6) discuss critically the application of A/R/Tography as a methodology within one's own teaching,
- 7) demonstrate the ability to provide constructive guidance to other participants in a collaborative process based on A/R/Tography.

Examination

A/R/Tography in Theory, 2.5 credits

(1001) Seminar and portfolio, 2.5 credits, regarding learning outcomes 1- 3. Grades: Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with distinction (VG).

A/R/Tography in *Practice*, 5 credits

(1002) Seminar and portfolio, 2.5 credits, regarding learning outcomes 4- 6. Grades: Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with distinction (VG).

(1003) Seminar and peer review, 2.5 credits, regarding learning outcome 7. Grades: Fail (U), Pass (G) or Pass with distinction (VG).

If a student has a decision from Stockholm University of the Arts about special pedagogical support due to functional variance, the examiner can decide on alternative forms of examination in consultation with the student.

Course Requirements

The course requires access to a digital platform for creating and presenting the exposition. This could be, for example, Research Catalogue, Padlet, own website or other digital platform where

image, film, sound and text can be combined. Instructions on free version of Padlet are given during the course.
