Petra Johnson (PhD) is an independent artist based at Lijiang Studio, Jixiang Village, Yunnan and the Department of Design & Innovation, Tongji University, Shanghai until August 2020. She has worked as lecturer in Contextual Studies in the UK (2001-2002, Dudley College) and China (2002-2006, College of Fine Arts, Shanghai University).

From 2004 to 2006 she acted as artist mentor for 'artistlink China-UK', a co-operation between the British Council and the Arts Council.

Petra has exhibited at the German Pavilion at the EXPO 2010, at the Shanghai Biennale in 2012/13, at Art Berlin in 2013 and by invitation of artist and curator Qiu Zhijie she has contributed to the Zhongshan Park Project in Xiamen; in Taidong, Taiwan and in Shanghai. In her solo exhibitions - Dartington, UK 2007; amspace, Shanghai 2008; Zendai Museum, Zhujiajiao, China 2011; Railway Art Centre, Taidong 2013; ReformerART, Shanghai, 2016; D & I, Tongji University, Shanghai 2017; Shanghai Glass Museum 2019 (with Olga Merekina); - she explores movement modes through the affective landscape by combining choreographic installations with walking projects.

Petra has also initiated two long-term research collectives:

The Screen Collective (2016) has held a number of high-profile public panels in Shanghai at Chronos Art Centre, Tongji University and Himalaya Museum; in Singapore at Nanyang Technological University and in Beijing (2018) with Steph DeBoers from Indiana University at the Media Architecture Biennale. The Movement Research Group (2018) is an independent post-doctoral research team and consists of anthropologist and dancer Marceau Chenault (East China Normal University) and animation artist Zhang Yinan (Tongji University). Our performance work has been shown at the Clore Gallery at SOAS, London.

Johnson's current dual role as resident artist in both a city (in Professor Zhou Hongtao's Making Lab at D & I, Tongji University, Shanghai) and a village (Jixiang Village near Lijiang, Yunnan) enables her to deepen research in the use of technologies past and present.

In 2018 Johnson devised a concept for artist led residencies in a rural environment. 'Mapping the Affective Landscape' brought together artists from different disciplines for a four week period and encouraged them to think of the locality as their curator. Spread over the entire year, these altogether four blocks of residencies hosted mature artists as well as recent graduates from all over the world during different stages of the agricultural calendar. In order to focus the artists' attention on the subtly changing relationship between their perception and the locality, each block was framed into a week of landing, a week of grounding, a week of finding and finally a week of founding: see also

This project laid the foundation for the 2019 group project: *A-LLA-LEI* (see https://lijiangstudio.org/a-lla-la-lei-intro) which curates activities in three villages around Lashihai and explores points of convergence between art and agriculture. It addresses the following questions:

- 1. How to create an environment that fine-tunes the ability to note and to disseminate local knowledge?
- 2. How to maximise traffic of knowledge from the rural to the urban, so it changes the city?

This year's residents and co-researchers include an anthropologist from India, a landscape sureyor, a farmer from the US, a leading professional at the Royal Academy of Art, London; musicians (US, South America, China and Japan); dancers (Japan, Russia), visual artists (London, Rome, Amsterdam) and professionals with backgrounds in architecture/urban planning (China).
