Alistair MacDonald

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Alistair MacDonald's practice is centred on the creative use of technology. Much of his work is collaborative and explores how technology can create bridges between modes of creation (composed, devised, improvised) and presentation (concerts; performative and static art installations; theatre, dance and site specific work). He also explores the fuzzy edges between cultures (combing classical, folk and jazz contexts and traditions) with other musicians who share diverse roots, often using recorded sound for its referential qualities to interrogate cultural identities.

He has created large scale interactive works, gallery installations and works for concert, dance, theatre, radio and film. Current projects include Strange Rainbow with Scottish harp player Catriona McKay and collaborative development, with Carrie Fertig, on music for glass percussion, electronics and live flame-working, recently selected for the Coburg Prize for Contemporary Glass. He is director of the electroacoustic studios at the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland where he was made Fellow of the Royal Conservatoire in 2012.
