### Credit system and marking

A student's workload (both contact hours, and hours spent studying and preparing assignments) is measured in ECTS credits, whereby under Dutch law one credit represents 28 hours of work and 60 credits represents one year of full-time study.

The marking system has been the same for several decades: the scale is from 1 (very poor) to 10 (outstanding).

The lowest pass mark is 6. The mark 9 is seldom awarded, and the highest pass mark 10 is extremely rare.

Decimal values may be used (e.g. 7.8).
