## "Imaginary Properties: Thinking Through (The) Manipulation(s)". A lecture-demonstration by Joa Hug (dancer/researcher)

In this lecture-demonstration, which is the first examined practical part of the artistic doctorate at Tutke, Joa Hug will give an introduction into how he is approaching the subject of his research: the relationship between sensing, perceiving and reflecting in performance.

In his approach, Hug explores this relationship in and through one of the main elements of the Body Weather training methodology: the so-called Manipulations. The question is, how the process of sensing, perceiving and reflecting is manipulated in and through this practice: What effect does consciously altering one's physical state and awareness have on one's way of reflecting, and vice versa: How can conscious activity of the mind alter the body's perception in relation to itself and to others?

Recently, Hug has worked on a research score that expands the original practice of the Manipulations into a medium for thinking through and reflecting on its own linguistic and conceptual premises, creating a glossary of basic terms that are used in the Body Weather training process. This glossary will be shared with the public by means of text and performance.

Joa Hug (Berlin/Helsinki) studied Dance at the School for New Dance Development (Amsterdam), completed the Artistic Research Master's program at the University of Amsterdam and is a doctoral student at Tutke in Dance. His research is artistically based in Body Weather. When: October 3rd, 5 pm
