Play every note in the previous line long, but without a defined pulse. Each instrument should move at a different pace, so try for the note changes to not occur at the same time. The first repeat for each instrument is to be played once, the latter one as many times as needed until all instruments are looping this last repeat. Once this happens, the violin should cue one last note (whichever is next for each instrument) to be played together and with the same length. After that, continue with the next line.

All of the above notes should be played like this:

Prelude to Dish 3

Improvise on these pitches, first introducing some notes of the first bracketed group as mordenti, and gradually introducing those of the second group. Finish on a long D with a mesa di voce, once the strings are playing their last harmonic.

Play each harmonic double stop in one bow and with a mesa di voce, from pp to mp. Violin and viol should be alternating their harmonics, so that one starts when the other one has reached the loudest point in their mesa di voce. Repeat the fragment three times, and during the last repeat, stay on the coloured harmonic as a long fermata (play it in as many bows as you need). The flute will finish its improvisation on a long D with a diminuendo, disappear with it, and the proceed to the following material.






