Premiered at the SinusTon Festival; US/Canada tour in 2017; 64-channel audio version commissioned by the Zurich Ballet; performed in February 2024 nine sold-out shows at Zurich Opera House.
- 2018-22 Designed Quiet Spheres, an artwork that traveled to the International Space Station (launched February 2022 from NASA in Virginia, orbited the earth 5680 times, and returned in January 2023) in collaboration with Nanoracks, ESA, NASA, and the Moon-Mars-Gallery project. This gallery originated in the ArtScience program through sculptor Alexander Zaklynsky, and is now led by KABK graduates Anna Sitnikova and Elizaveta Glukhova.

Guy appears as an expert on early torpedo guidance systems, discussing George Antheil and Hedy Lamar's invention of spread spectrum communication, which they patented in 1941 as a torpedo guidance protocol. Their invention was inspired by Antheil's earlier work with player pianos in Paris; and by Lamar's knowledge of munitions and Austrian weaponry. Eventually this led to the development of the frequency hopping technology now used in wifi.
