A series of shorts done in collaboration. The photos and texts in the videos are by Estonian artist Sirja-Liisa Eelma, the narration and editing were done by me.

We began the project as a response to or extension of a cancelled exhibition of Sirja-Liisa's in April 2020, regarding the COVID-19 lockdown.

The texts and photos are from Sirja-Liisa's stay at an artist residency in France, in autumn 2019. We made a selection from these "postcards", and posted a series of concurrent videos on social media spanning the period when the exhibition would've taken place.

From December 2020 through January 2021, we exhibited the piece at Hop gallery in Tallinn.








EAA MASTER'S DEGREE GRADUATION EXHIBITION TASE'16 (supervised by Raul Keller)

This work focuses on a certain undercurrent beneath technological optimism – the paradox of technological emancipation.

A transhumanist vision of our future foresees the integration of flesh and technology, the total externalisation and storage of human's central nervous system and subjective consciousness into a designated cyberspace. This is a cybernetic dream of transferring human cognition and experiential structures to computers, in order to surmount the fragmentary, disconnected nature of the physical world, the inherent communicative ambiguity of languages, transcultural discrepancies, excessive inefficiency, sickness, even mortality.

Marshall McLuhan terms this as "spiritual information"; adhering to this aspiration means abandoning the body, or becoming emancipated from its burdens, and translating our Cartesian consciousness, separate from

flesh, into code, and all its rigid linearity and functionality.

This is an extreme, technophile fancy, which has slowly and steadily been taking root since the 1960s. In this dream, one reality is replaced with another, more rational, cerebral reality, and one seeps outward from one's human skin, into the expanses our self-made cosmos.

WITH KULLA LAAS

A collaborative site-specific installation created for the urban art festival UIT 2015 in Tartu, on an abandoned plot at the address Kuu 24 ("Moon 24").

A giant helium-filled balloon, attached to a dilapidated house on an abandoned lot, floating a few meters above the roof of the building. The "moon" glowed in the dark, casting light on both the roof and the overgrown grass and weeds in the yard.

This went in context with the urban festival for which the piece was created; to give new perspectives and meaning to certain lesser-known parts of the city of Tartu.



Eight openable drawers (as noted on the image below). Opening any of these drawers activated a monologue. These were various selected texts from the Estonian blogosphere, read by different voices. When a drawer was closed and opened again, the audio narration changed randomly. The drawers themselves were empty and worked as small acoustic spaces.

The piece was created with regard to the polemic of privacy as it relates to the development of social media and, concurrently, a certain feeling of anxiety.

A site-specific piece created in an abandoned administrative building and former power plant in Tallinn's Noblessner quarter, where they used to build ships.

When the Peetri 7 building was officially closed off many years ago, all the furniture, documents, phones, calendars, posters etc. were left behind as they were. Over the years, the building was occasionally marauded, and used by both vagrants for living in and by film crews as a set.

The motive for the whole exhibition was to change as little as possible in the abandoned and dilapidated space, and rather amplify, with small gestures, its various idiosyncracies.

I found the poster of cats glued to the old printing machine as is. The sound heard in the video was audible on-site; a recording of my own cat (now deceased) purring.


