Katie Lee's work ranges from large-scale architecturally sited installations to small, whimsical ink drawings; however, common to all of her works is a preoccupation with revealing 'the way things are.' This preoccupation manifests in her sculptural work as forms resembling familiar objects, such as furniture, tools or instruments. Recurring materials include hanging lengths of rubber, steel bars, stools, ceramic balls and timber planks. In these forms and materials, Lee finds a reflection of our built environment alongside their psychological and embodied affect.

Lee has recently completed a PhD at the Victorian College of the Arts, University of Melbourne. She holds a Master of Visual Arts by research from RMIT (2009) and has also studied postgraduate education and urban planning. Lee has served on the board of Conical Inc., Gertrude Contemporary and West Space. She is lecturer in Creative Arts and Expanded Performance at Deakin University.
