

Robert Franenberg was born in Los Angeles, California, USA. In 1981 he received the degree of Bachelor of Music cum laude from the California State University, Northridge. From 1982-1984 he continued his studies with Anthony Woodrow at the Sweelinck Conservatory in Amsterdam. Since 1984 Robert Franenberg has been a member of the Rotterdam Philharmonic Orchestra, choosing in 1986 to work part time there to allow him to deepen his interest period instrument performance. He has been a member of the Orchestra of the 18th Century since 1988 and since 1987 has been the contrabass/violone player of the Nederlandse Bachvereniging (Netherlands Bach Society). Alongside these ensembles he has performed with The Gabrieli Consort and Players, The Bach Collegium Japan, De Nederlands Blazers, The Chamber Orchestra of Europe, The English Concert and the Dunedin Consort. In May 2015 he performed the Concerto for Contrabass by Johann Baptist Vanhal with the Apollo Ensemble, which was also televised on Brava TV. Robert Franenberg has given lecture/recitals about the Viennese contrabass at the Viennese Bass Days in Amsterdam (2016-2019) and at the Basseurope Congress (BASS2014) in Almere, The Netherlands and (BASS2018) in Lucca, Italy.
