ART IS NOT EXHIBITED, ART EXHIBITS

'Display' is bij uitstek een sociaal gebaar: ik laat jou en de wereld iets zien. De manier waarop dat gebeurt is bepalend voor hoe je het ziet, interpreteert, ervarpt, waardert. Display Slow onderzoekt precies dit proces en laat zien hoe 'display' een intrinsiek onderdeel is van de artistieke productie en interpretatie. Display Slow trekt een lijn van iets-doen-om-iets-te-tonen (wat in de twintigste eeuwse kunsttheorie 'to display' is gaan lezen) naar het idee dat dit niet alleen het karakter van het gepresenteerde verandert, maar ook ons zelf en onze omgeving.

De tentoonstelling presenteert nieuwe en recente werken die zijn ingebied in, bepaald of veranderd door de manier waarop ze worden gepresenteerd. De radicale ideeën over presentatie van twintigste-eeuwse architecten, ontwerpers en kunstenaars klinken door in interpretaties, reconstructies en kopieën.



Met Display Slow introduceert Stroom Céline Condorelli als één van de vier kunstenaars met wie ze samenwerkt in het programma Attempts to Read the World (Differently). Een programma waarin Stroom op zoekende, intuïtieve wijze de kantelpériode waarin de wereld zich bevindt probeert te lezen. Fernando Sanchez Castillo, Dunja Herzog en Neil Beloufa zijn de andere drie kunstenaars. Zij zetten de eerste stappen in het anders lezen, interpreteren, verbeelding van de wereld, het herijken van een navigatiesysteem, het zoeken naar nieuwe vormen van kennis, informatie of communicatie.






The exhibition shows works that are embedded in or changed by the way in which they are presented. *Display Show* is curated by Céline Condorelli, Gavin Wade and James Langdon.

Display Show presents existing and new works by a group of international artists: Céline Condorelli, Charlotte Cullinan & Jeanine Richards, Koenraad Dedobbeleer, Flore Nové-Josserand, Goshka Macuga, Rita McBride, Ellis McDonald, Nathalie du Pasquier, Amalia Pica, Yelena Popova, Haim Steinbach, Gavin Wade, Nicole Wermers and Christopher Williams.


