Dear Million Dollar Challenge Committee --

Thank you very much for your response. While I appreciate your sympathy, sympathy doth butter no bread. Consequently, I would still very much like an opportunity to "prove it and win." ! I am quite happy to proceed at my own expense.

I have consulted with my friend, math teacher and ghost hunter, Philemon Vanderbeck. He has run the maths using some form of combinatorics formula. The maths are included below, but the long and short of it is that he assures me that with my current levels of hit rates -- which are currently holding steady at nearly double the mean chance expectation (ie., 2 out of 5 in extended randomized closed runs of Zener cards over hundreds of trials) -- that I should have no problem overcoming odds of one-in-a-million. In fact, he is quite certain that I will be out of your hair before lunchtime.

The conclusion of Mr. Vanderbeck is that the odds of achieving twice the MCE over a 25 card run is approximately 1 in 100. Therefore, two runs of 25 cards would net the preliminary odds of 1 in 10,000 against chance. A third 25 card run would yield odds of 1 in 1,000,000.

Here are the maths, according to Mr. Vanderbeck:

Sometimes it's easier to figure out the odds of getting it wrong and then using the reciprocal. Anyways, you use a combinatorics formula.

$$P(X=10) = (25 C 10) * (1/5)^{10} * (4/5)^{25-10}$$

25 is the number of cards in the deck

10 is the number that you get right

1/5 is the odds of getting a card right

4/5 are the odds of getting a card wrong

The (25 C 10) is "25 choose 10" which involves factorials. 25!/(10!15!).

You can also write that as the Combination function C(25,10).

The odds of getting 10 out of 25 correct is about 1.18% per trial. So, it's just a little more than 1 out of a 100.

If you got these results in three trials, that would get you your 1 in a 1,000,000 odds.

Therefore, with all due respect, I would very much like to proceed with the Million Dollar Challenge. If I might answer any questions or provide any further information, please don't hesitate to let me know. Thanks in advance for your support.
