Research Interests

I am a leading British Artist whose practice resides at the intersection of photography, sculpture and architecture, where both ontological and phenomenological questions relating to photography and moving image are explored through the making of large-scale installations. My twin research interests are the role of visual arts in the cultural assimilation of fundamental science/space exploration and the objecthood of photography: My work was selected in 2013 by Tate Britain Director, Dr Penelope Curtis, for the exhibition *Looking at the View* in recognition of the distinctive contribution my work has made to the visual and ideological construction of space, place and landscape and my Leverhulme Research Fellowship, *Material Sight: Representing the Spaces of Fundamental Science* used non-documentary photography and moving image to interrogate extremes of visual and imaginative representation in fundamental science and technology.

A survey exhibition, *Weighting Time*, brought together 30 years of my practice and research in 2023 and will be followed by a monograph, *Wrongfooting* due to be published at the end of 2025. My work is represented by Matt's Gallery London and held in major UK collections including the Tate, Arts Council, British Council, Government Art Collection and the National Trust. I am a co-founder (2013) and co-lead of the Cultural Negotiation of Science research group at Northumbria University, UK.
