Employment:

Senior Lecturer, Fine Art, School of Art & Design, Nottingham Trent University, BA/MA/PhD since Sept. 2007; Fellow of the Higher Education Academy, since July 2010. From 2007-2012 I taught on the BA Hons Photography course before taking on the responsibilities of initially writing and subsequently running the MFA in Fine Art until 2017, when I decided to reduce my managerial duties in order to focus more on my work as a practicing artist which also resulted in three successful application to the NTU Sabbatical and Strategic Research Funding program. My Research Outputs will from part of the overall research at NTU to be put forward for the forthcoming REF.

As well as my involvement with the MFA, over the years my duties included, amongst others, the writing and running of modules, the validation of internal and external courses, internal independent PhD examiner, external examination of PhDs, as well as the supervision of PhDs. As overseas exchange coordinator, I developed a program for international staff exchange with partner institutions in Europe, USA and the Far East as well as supported students with their overseas stay and then reintegration into the course after their return. Currently my

teaching focusses on the third year BA and the MFA in Fine Art as well as working and supervising PhD students. Throughout all of my teaching I have made room, where possible and appropriate, for interdisciplinary and cross level engagement and working. Since 2019 I am running the Live Lecture series which includes guests such as Jeremey Deller, Esther Leslie, Richard Wentworth.
