Biographical Note

Rebecca J. Squires is an artist-researcher and curator at LUCA School of Arts, KU Leuven, Brussels. Squires' artistic experiment, *The Grand Tour*, a human-pulled carriage journey, toured Belgium in 2022, featuring in the 2022 symposium Re-Envisioning the View: Deconstruction of Colonial Perspectives, LUCA School of Arts, Brussels, and the performance art platform To Be Antwerp, 2022. *The Grand Tour* traversed Düsseldorf in 2024 as a stadt.raum.experimente project for the Kunstkommission Düsseldorf, culminating in an exhibition at the Künstlerverein Malkasten in collaboration with Bart Geerts, as well as an installation and presentation at the Kunsthalle Düsseldorf. Squires' performative walk and talk, *The Radical Traverse of Space-Time Through the Picturesque Landscape: A SHORTKUT Walk, Talk, and Re-Envisioning of J.M.W. Turner's Schöllenen Gorge* was conceived in collaboration with Nino Baumgartner for Traversing Topologies, Swiss Artistic Research Network, Andermatt, 2022. *Pittura Infamante*, a performance of self-hanging, took place at Aalto University in Espoo, Finland, 2017. Squires was an artist in residence at the BAC Art Lab, Leuven from 2021 to 2023, and curator of the Nordic premiere of Swiss artist Klaus Lutz at Alvar Aalto's beta Space in Espoo, Finland, 2017.
