Jan Kenneth Weckman, born 10.2.1946 in Helsinki. Graduated from Svenska Normallyceum Helsinki 1967 (Swedish college), Oriental and Roman Latin studies 1967-1969, Helsinki University, Fine Art education: Finishing the Art Academy School (1969-1973), Helsinki, works in hospitals, in Helsinki and Stockholm, until 1980; took part in establishing one of the first vegetarian restaurants in Finland 1973-75; a career as draughtsman and painter developed at the end of 1970's and beginning of 1980's; simultaneously established himself as a fine art teacher at the University of Art and Design, Helsinki;

Weckman published a poetry collection in 1978, in Swedish, developed a personal approach to art studies during 1990's involving semiology and visual semiotics for teachings in pictorial composition at the University of Art and Design; during 1989-1992 lived and worked in Ceaux-en-Loudun, France. Weckman engaged in artist policy and union work as vicechair for the Finnish Graphic Artists (1981-1982, chair 1995-1997) and chair of Artist Association of Finland 1983-1985, and worked as vicechair for the Finnish Fine Art Council 1997-2002 within the Ministry of Education, and vicechair of the Artist Remuneration Commission within Ministry of Education 2003-2004.

During his professorship at the University of Art and Design and dean of the School of Visual culture, 2003-2005, Weckman was head of the Finnish partnership in a EU funded Culture 2000 project Digital Surface and delivered a paper at the Digital Surface conference 2003, Tate Britain, London, see url: www.uiah.fi/to/DS_site/index.htm; tutoring an EU funded collaboration between department of Art Education, University of Art and Design, Helsinki, The Latvian Art Academy, Riga, Dublin Institute of Design: *Virtual Learning Environments in Art, Design and Education Conference*, 6th -7th September 2007, Dublin, Ireland; Jan Kenneth Weckman is married (3rd time), and has 7 children between 49 and 33 years of age. Weckman works currently as a free-lancer art teacher often tutoring and reviewing MA and Applied Sciences art degree thesis work. Weckman has done several pre-examinations for doctoral degree specifically concerning the practice-based fine art productions, at the University of Art and Design Helsinki and Lappland University, Rovaniemi, and has evaluated shortlisted candidates for professorship in painting at the Tel Aviv Art Academy , Israel, candidates for professorship in Fine Art at Lapland University and candidates for professorship in painting at Kuvataideakatemia, Helsinki (in progress 2020).
