# **Pedagogic Interests**

These lie within the areas of embodied learning and engaging the learning community, assessment and teaching methods in dance, with a particular focus on teaching and learning within choreographic contexts and the value of improvisation in dance practice and performance. In order to pursue these interests I have been supported through Staff Development to further my training in Bartenieff Fundamentals work at London Metropolitan University (2009/2010) and to attend the Dance and Somatics International Conferences at Coventry University (2011/2013/2015/2017), To teach as a guest artist in Southern Italy and Poland (2016) and to share research at symposiums and conferences Internationally (2016-2017). My interest in assessment practices was largely developed through research carried out as part of my PGcertHE, under the supervision of Dr Carole Davis, and beyond this into the Curriculum Design of key level 5 and 6 modules with the BA Dance Performance

Programme (2010/11) and subsequently at level 7 through the MA Professional Practice, Dance Technique Pedagogy programme. My interest in strategies for engaging learning communities and 'non-traditional' learners is fueled through my work on this MA programme also. Currently I am engaged in Practice as Research around improvisation in dance performance contexts, space, identity and gender (this forming the basis of my PhD).
