OPENING with Phyllis Omido (Winner of the Alternative Nobel Prize 2023)

For the opening of the conference we have invited the alternative Nobel Prize winner Phyllis Phyllis Omido to Graz to address the problems and the impacts of the waste of resources and the resulting destruction and scars.

Phyllis Omido, a Kenyan environmental activist, is committed to justice and the health of the residents of Owino-Uhuru. They have been suffering from lead poisoning ever since a battery recycling plant was put into operation in their village. Their work was honoured with the alternative Nobel Peace Prize in 2023 (= Right Livelihood Award), which is recognised as a pioneering example of people's right to a right to a clean and healthy environment and the responsibility of the state to protect it.

The Manifesto developed on Tuesday and Wednesday will be presented the first time here. From Graz the manifesto will start a journey to Budapest, Berlin, Munich, Eindhoven and Brussels.

In Case – durational performance

IN CASE shows the ongoing process of "being"; a self-regulating world, a biosphere, with maneuvers on the square cm., by scanning the space and each other, with silences, the breath, with body heat and sweat. Condensation blurs the view and the wiping and drawing in this natural haze turn this process into a beautiful balance between classical beauty and basic, animal like acting.

The environment is an inflatable transparent bubble; comparable with an autarkic biosphere, an egg maybe or a uterus.

The audience is welcome to visit this world during multiple hours, to observe and absorb; it can leave to come back later. Performers will stay, that much is sure; In Case, an ongoing process that shows growth, blossom as well as fall of Human in all fullness, from the visual and physical power that characterizes the Cowboys. There is only a thin plastic membrane that separates performers from audience; we can reach out, get really close, only some millimeters apart, but there is still the inside and the outside of the bubble...

United Cowboys, dance and performance Company from Eindhoven The Netherlands creates performances that lug the audience along, by a different approach of timing, space and presentation. Experiences, that rock between beauty, vulnerability, intimacy, and consolation.

Children of Compost – Installation 24 - Videoinstallation

In Children of Compost - Installation 24, speculative memories become active between yesterday, today and tomorrow in the coexistence of humans, animals and and nature.

The background is formed by research in a renaturalised urban area in Munich. Burning piles of rubbish, a toxic lake, a sunken village, a displaced Roma settlement, numerous citizens' initiatives and the reports of contemporary witnesses are layered to create a picture of today's local recreation





The interweaving of the fragments of memory buried under the turf, documentary material and fictional overwritings turn to the blind spots, the unsaid and the unseen.
