COMPULSORY COMPONENTS FOR RESEARCH FELLOWS RESEARCH FELLOWSHIP SEMINARS - AUTUMN TERM:



Quote from the Regulations, § 5.4:

The compulsory part of the programme shall contain such academic and theoretical training as is desirable with respect to the work on the artistic project. This part of the programme aims to stimulate research fellows to engage in artistic self-reflection and insight, to develop their communication skills and to encourage critical debate on artistic issues. In each project, the compulsory programme shall contribute to focus on a broader context and to guide the project towards relevant professional discourse. Throughout the compulsory programme, emphasis shall be placed on adopting a cross disciplinary artistic approach and placing artistic research in a broader context.

As part of the compulsory part of the programme the research fellow will give presentations of her/his project - and discuss various aspects of it - in both plenary and group sessions at the fellowship seminars. The research fellow will prepare her/his presentation in cooperation with the supervisor(s), and the experience provided by the presentations and the feedback given by the seminar participants should be used in the further dialogue between research fellow and supervisor.

The composition of the groups will be cross-disciplinary. All groups are preset by the Steering Committee. The research fellow and her/his supervisor(s) will be placed in the same group every time the research fellow is expected to give a presentation. A member of the programme board will chair each group.

Working language is English in all settings - plenary as well as group sessions.

The issues for the coming seminar are:

Where could a challenge should occur in the work? - Partner Presentations 2^{nd.} year Research Fellows present another fellow's project in Group Sessions

In order to address this, we will organise the second year fellows in pairs and ask them to give a short presentation of their own project and to prepare a comment on their partner's project.

The intention with these discussion groups is both to get an awareness of how your own project develops as well as an exercise in 'reading' other peoples projects. The discussion with the rest of the group aims to shed light on whether we can and want to plan some kind of resistance and friction when building the project.

Travelling costs etc.:

The programme will cover the stay for at Voksenåsen for fellows and supervisors for the period of the seminar. For the new fellows and their supervisors we will also cover the stay from Monday morning until Tuesday - pending participation in the Introduction Seminar on Monday.

Personal costs, such as drinks, telephone calls, extra meals and extra nights etc., have to be covered by the individual participant when checking out.

The programme will also refund actual travelling costs for fellows and supervisors, on the condition that the lowest combination of ticket costs and travel methods have been used. Costs above this (as for instance the use of taxi), have to be endorsed in advance by the Programme Director in writing to be refunded.

Institutional representatives will have to cover both travels and stay by their own institution. The stay will subsequently be charged to your institution.

For all participants: Any meals or hotel accommodation confirmed in the registration form, will - if not attended or used - be charged to your institution. Any subsistence allowances must be arranged with your institution in advance.

DIRECTIONS - VOKSENÅSEN:

Voksenåsen kultur og konferansehotell:

Arriving by plane/train:

Oslo is easily reached by a convenient train shuttle system from Gardermoen airport (takes approx. 25 min.). From Oslo S (Oslo Central Station), the hotel can be reached by taking the underground line no. 1 *Frognerseteren* to the penultimate station, Voksenkollen. Journey takes approx. 30 min, Voksenåsen is a 10 minute walk from Voksenkollen station.

NB:

The hotel has informed us that the normal tram transport from Oslo Centre to the hotel is suspended for the last part of the trip, and substituted by buss. This calls for extra time to reach the hotel, and you should plan for at least 1 hour and 15 min from the City Centre.

Arriving by car:

Follow the signs for Majorstua/Smestad. Straight after the Smestad intersection, take a right turn towards Holmenkollen. Drive up the Holmenkollen road past the ski jump, following signposts marked Voksenkollen. Make sure to take a left turn at the Frognersteren/Tryvann crossroads, take care however, as the crossroads suddenly appears from out of nowhere! Once at Voksenkollen station (on your right hand side), drive up the road leading off from the left hand side at the crossroads, you'll notice a large, white sign for *Voksenåsen kultur- og konferansehotell*. On your way up to the hotel, you will pass the Voksentoppen Allergy Institute.
