Author's Biography

Elin T. Sørensen is a visual artist, animator and landscape architecture, trained in Norway, Finland and Estonia. Her practice involves site-specific concerns and co-creation with an emphasis on the ocean, ecological processes and the possible inclusion of nonhuman lifeforms. The artistic development unfolds on a slow-time basis to reflect the interactions and dialogues with landscapes, people, knowledge-fields and the species with which we share the environment: within this, the emerging artworks are often expressed as temporary situations where artefacts return to the original context or material cycle after completion.

Her research interests include practice-based research in the arts and architecture, urban sea areas and the urban intertidal, ecology and integrated urban water management, co-creational practices and more-than-human care.

Sørensen's work experience started within the arts after graduating from The Oslo National Academy of the Arts in 1999: practicing both as an experimental installation artist and a curator with a keen interest in sound art. After completing the Master Program at Landsam (NMBU) in 2008, she worked two years as a specialist advisor on sustainable urban planning at The Agency for Planning and Building Services, City of Oslo. Thereafter, working as a consultant in the private sector concerned with urban water management and nature-based solutions at Plan Urban and COWI Oslo respectively — before embarking on the PhD Program at Landsam in 2016. Sørensen founded the proprietorship Urban Living Laboratory in 2010, and today works as an artist and independent consultant specialising on a marine landscape architecture.
