as we need.

(entering the time between the pages.)

Now you hopefully have a manifold experience of this place.

To finish the etude,
come together and take a look at the other members
Let the memory of the experience move between you.

put the letter back to the envelope
and give your attention to Charlotta, who will continue from here.
